

## INTERNATIONAL TRIAL

### MUNSTER v. LEINSTER.

In connection with Saturday's trial at the Mardyke the Munster Five met in Dublin after the Ulster v. Munster match, on Wednesday last, and selected the following to represent Munster:—

Full-Back—D. O'Connell (Constitution).  
Threequarters—J. Favier (Constitution), Dr. D. Sullivan (Dolphin and London Irish), J. Murphy-O'Connor (University), Dr. W. Hamilton (do.).

Halves—R. Barry (Constitution) (scrum), and J. W. Wellwood (Dolphin) (out).

Forwards—M. J. Bradley (Dolphin) (captain), I. Popham (Constitution), J. Mahony (Dolphin), T. O'Sullivan (Dolphin), B. Browne (Constitution), D. Daly (Constitution), M. Leahy (U.C.C.), J. Cunningham (Constitution).

The team selected is the same as played against Ulster, except that Hamilton and Wellwood exchange places, and O'Malley (London Irish), who played as substitute for R. Barry (Constitution), is dropped, as Barry is now fit to take part.

During the progress of the match on Wednesday the alteration took place in the back division, which considerably improved the Munster attack, and within a few minutes of full-time Munster, although playing against a strong westerly gale, equalised, bringing the teams level—six points each. A penalty goal and a try just before the final whistle gave the Ulster team the winning lead. The Leinster team arrive in town this afternoon, and are travelling with a powerful combination, no less than seven Internationals figuring on the XV.

Each player will be numbered, and this will add considerably to the interest in the match. The Irish "Five" to select the Irish International team will also be present. The committee in charge of the grounds have completed arrangements for the comfort of the huge company that will be present, and seats can still be booked for the reserved and covered stand at Messrs. Roche's (Jewellers), Patrick street. All stewards are requested to be at the grounds this (Friday) afternoon at 4.30 p.m.

The Leinster XV. arrive in Cork this evening, and will be present to-night at the second house in the Palace Theatre.
