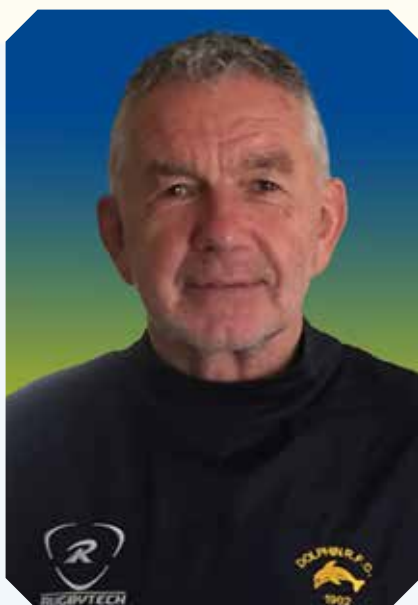

Ballymena



Ballymena was first affiliated to the Northern Branch of the IRFU in 1887, but the club as it is today, began playing after the First World War. Following successive Ulster Junior League wins in the early 50's, they sought and were granted Senior Status in 1952. Two years later they moved to their present grounds Eaton Park, then 9 acres, a couple of decades later extending to over 30 acres.

May 2003 saw one of the biggest days in the club history – They became AIL Division 1 Champions when they defeated Clontarf in the final at Lansdowne Road. It was a day Dolphin will not forget either, the previous game being the Division 2 Final in which Dolphin defeated Old Crescent.

They also have an active Cricket Section within the club, with three adult and underage sides.

They currently have 5 Adult sides as well as Youths & Minis sides. Ballymena set up a Ladies section in November 2017 and are currently fielding at U12, U14, U16 & U 18.

Unusually Dolphin have a better record against Ballymena @ Eaton Park winning three times, rather than @ Musgrave Park winning only twice.

The sides are played each other 15 times, one of those was Dolphin's first ever Division 1 game. They have drawn twice at Musgrave Park, Dolphin were 14 points ahead in both games before Ballymena drew level at the end of the game.

Of the current squad, Daryl Foley is the top try scorer against Ballymena with two tries.

Sevens Rugby – from a Dolphin perspective

Seven-a-side rugby was first played in 1883 in Melrose, a prosperous little town in the South of Scotland, an area known as the Scottish Borders.

Nowadays there is hardly a rugby territory in the world without its own Sevens tournament and for a nearly a century Sevens rugby remained a wonderful pastime, played by clubs and teams to wind up a long and demanding season or as a gentle build-up to the new one.

The Musgrave Cup was a 7 a side trophy played for by Munster Clubs in the 1930's & 40's. Dolphin were winners in 1948 & 1949. Other 7's trophy's won were the Dooradoyle Cup in 1966/67 & 1967/68, Army 7's in 1971/72, Abbeyfeale 7's 1975/76 & Pfizers 1978/79.

One of the best known events is the Middlesex 7's, Sale were the first non London side to win it. On the Sale side that day was former Dolphin & Munster winger Niall (Nux) McCormack.

The first Rugby Sevens World Cup took place in 1993 and the IRB Sevens World Series commenced in 1999.

Tomás O'Leary was Dolphin's first Seven's international. He played in his first tournament in Dubai, United Arab Emirates in December 2004. The following week the squad moved on to George, South Africa and after an intensive weeks training Tomás finished the tournament as Ireland's top try scorer with 5 tries.

He also played in the World Cup finals in Hong Kong in March 2005. It was not a very successful tournament for Ireland; it's interesting to note that Lifeimi Mafi played for New Zealand v Ireland in the opening round.

James was a guest on the Ulster Presidents 7 in the Melrose 7's in April and made his International Sevens debut in the Odense Tournament in Denmark the following month.

Ireland finished runners up to Wales, being defeated in the final with a drop goal in sudden death, having been 26-all at full time. The aim for the 2008 squad was to qualify for the 2009 RWC.

The squad went on to win the tournament in Poland, scoring 204 points, conceding none. By finishing fourth in the Hanover Tournament in July, Ireland qualified for the 2009

World Cup finals. James scored a try in the defeat by Wales.

Peter Owens played for Dolphin in 2006/07, he was already an experienced Australian Seven's International at that stage, earning his first cap in May 2004 scoring five tries in his first three internationals at the Bordeaux Sevens.

On his return from Cork he went back on the World Sevens circuit, having his most successful season in 2008. He scored 22 tries and 206 points in total and was the 2nd highest points scorer in the series that year. He represented Australia 51 times, scoring a total of 256 points including 32 tries. He was the 18th highest World Rugby Sevens (all time) points scorer at one stage.

Peter Phelan is a name well known in Seven's circles. He was a regular with the DHL Irish Exiles squad, which are one of the top sides in Europe- seeded in tournaments like Amsterdam Sevens. He was on the Kooga Wailers side that won the Kinsale Sevens in 2007.

Mike Pettman had made the New Zealand 7's squad before to came to Dolphin in 2002. He has also considerable 7's coaching experience in his native New Zealand and with Munster.

Munster sent a Seven's side to play in the City of Stirling Seven's in 2007, it contained Barry Keeshan and Barry O'Mahony.



Alex Molloy was on the Ireland side that won the Rugby Europe U18 Sevens championship in Bucharest in September 2016. Another member of the squad was former Dolphin scrum half, Colin Sisk.

In 2018 we were joined by Jussi Viljanen the Finish 15's and 7's captain. The following season new signing Albert Fronek and Jussi were having a chat after an AIL game, when they discovered they had played against each other when Finland played a 7's international v the Czech Republic.

One of Dolphin's best displays

Dolphin 24; Ballymena R.F.C. 3
DOLPHIN put in one of their best performances of the year, when they crushed an under-strength yet powerful Northern side at Musgrave Park on Saturday last. Dolphin were resourceful and commanding at all times.

Dolphin won a majority of possession from the line-outs, and also from the scrums. This was particularly so in the second half when Ballymena were forced to reshuffle their team. Outhalf Disser Williamson got a knock on the leg and retired to a position more or less as a second full back. Winger John Kilpatrick went full back, and full back Wallace Ewart took over the outhalf berth. Steve McLean, Ballymena's number 7 forward, then reverted to the wing.

Dolphin's full back, Dave Coen,

opened the scoring after five minutes, when he kicked a 35 yard penalty. He gave Dolphin an added boost five minutes later when he landed another penalty from practically the same range. In the 16th minute, Ballymena showed their class, when their pack won a loose ruck inside the Dolphin 25. The ball was quickly flashed along the Ballymena three-quarters and sprinter David Meharg made the overlap, to leave the Dolphin defence spreadeagled. He scored half-way between the posts and the corner flag. Outhalf Disser Williamson failed with the conversion. The scoreline remained 6-3 in favour of Dolphin at half time.

The second half was five minutes old when, following a great forward rush by Dolphin with wing forward Bill Crowley predominant, second row Tom Dwyer got the touchdown. The redoubtable Dave Coen added the points. It was all Dolphin ten minutes later, when following a piece of intelligent play by Dolphin's Noel Elliott, who had his usual good game, prop Jack O'Rourke burst his way through from the end of a line-out and dived over. Coen converted easily.

All the heart went out of Ballymena when, in the 22nd minute, Dolphin's centre Mick Daly gave a cute little kick ahead from inside the visitors' half, and Frank Forrest, his partner, was up like a flash to gather the bounce and run over for a fine try. Dave Coen once again added the points. Dolphin's scrum-half Tim O'Kelly, who had no small part in his sides' victory, put the last nail in Ballymena's coffin, when some eight minutes from time, he expertly dropped a goal from inside the opponents' 25.

Lansdowne and Terenure get through

The remaining second round ties in the Leinster Senior Cup provided dull fare in summer-like conditions at Lansdowne Road on Saturday and the 160 minutes produced only a solitary try. As anticipated Lansdowne and Terenure advanced to the semi-final stage in which they will meet U.C.D. and St. Marys respectively next Saturday.

Lansdowne were just the better of two moderate sides but the defences were so dominant that it was a forward John Craig the blind side flanker who crowned a fine individual display by getting vital try, which J. Barry converted. Palmerston 10.

1. John O'Mahony had the most successful day with the boot v Malone in 2000/01 when he had 100% return kicking 10/10.
2. Cian McGovern kicked 10 penalties & John O'Mahony 10 drop goals.
3. Darragh O'Mahony was the fastest player to reach 10 tries in 31 appearances. Also with 10 All Ireland League & Cup tries is Rory Kenneally (in 35 games) John Quill, Barry Sheehan, Gary O'Keeffe & Will Hanley.
4. Two players scored 10 tries in a season, Conor Mahony 1996/97 & James Coughlan 2005/06.
5. Scored 10 tries in a game just once, game 234, an AIB Cup 64-0 v Malone 01/11/2008, Rory Kenneally being credited with the final try.
6. Dolphin's 10th AIL game was on 10.10.92 v Blackrock College, a 14-08 victory.
7. Have played two sides 10 times, Bective Rangers (5 Wins, 1 Draw & 4 Losses) and Greystones (5 Wins, 5 Losses).
8. Dolphin scored 10 points in 24 games, winning just 4 (17%) of them.
9. Dolphin conceded 10 points in 20 games but won 17 (85%), drew 1 & lost 2.
10. There are 10 players who have played over 100 All Ireland League & Cup games for Dolphin. They are Barry Keeshan, Dave O' Mahony, John O'Mahony, Donnchadha Murphy, Rob O'Herlihy, Chris Rowe, George Finn, Dave Pomeroy, Christy Condon & James Coughlan.

The last fact was a late replacement, it replaced "Dolphin scored 40 points or more in an All Ireland League or Cup game 10 times" - Thanks lads, but the 56-13 win over Rainey Old Boys was worth it.

- o Dolphin's 56 points v Rainey Old Boys was the highest points scored by any side across all divisions so far this season.
- o Only Greystones (69) and Enniscorthy (60) had a greater points difference than Dolphin (57).
- o Clontarf & Greystones (15) are the only sides to have conceded less points than Dolphin (19) (Cashel 18 but actually played 1 game).
- o In Division 1A, three sides had not registered any points.
- o Greystones are the only team in 2B to win both of their opening 2 games, eight sides won 1 game and Malahide won none, but have 2 bonus points.

DOLPHIN ONLY (Rainey Old Boys)

- o Three players scored first Dolphin AIL try, Murray Linn & Craig O'Connell on their debuts.
- o The winning margin (43) was the club's 4th highest in a AIL or All Ireland Cup game.
- o Highest points in a game – 64 Malone 2008-09 (All Ireland Cup) 61 Greystones 2000-01 56 Portadown 2002-03 & Rainey Old Boys 2021-22.
- o Daryl Foley joins Mick Kiernan & John O'Mahony on scoring six conversions in a game, Barry Keeshan lies ahead on seven.

AIL Round 3

- o Highfield are the only Cork Club with three wins. Dolphin have two and Midleton have one. Cork Constitution, UCC and Sundays Well have yet to register a win.
- o Munster sides lead Division 1A & 1B, while the biggest number of Munster sides is in 2A, where they are 5th (Dolphin) 6th 7th, 9th & 10th.
- o Today's opponents Ballymena are 4th, a point ahead of Dolphin, despite the heavy defeat to Queens in the last game, Dolphin are only slightly behind in points difference -5 to -3.
- o 15/50 sides have not won any of their opening three games.
- o While there are 15 Munster sides in the AIL, there are none in Division 2B.
- o There are five sides with maximum points after three games, Garryowen, Highfield, Enniscorthy and from Division 2A, Queens University & M U Barnhall.

Club Captain Kevin Allen is looking forward to his 75th AIL appearance for Dolphin as he overtakes Hugh Farrelly to become the 19th most capped Dolphin player in the AIL.
