

Barnhall



Barnhall is one of the "Youngest" AIL clubs in the country. The Leixlip based club was founded by employees of Irish Meat Packers in 1969 and in 1986 purchased their grounds from the company. It took just 30 years for them to achieve Senior Status. Their association with NIUM started in 2005 and in 2010 they changed their name to include Maynooth University.

They currently have 700 playing members and 200 non playing members.

To many, the best known Barnhall name is Trevor Brennan, Dolphin encountered Trevor many times with St Mary's College but looking at other Interprovincials Brendan Burke would have faced Dolphin a number of times for Barnhall.

The first time the sides met was in 2002 when Barnhall came to Cork and won by 30-9. Dolphin won the next four fixtures between the sides, the last of which was the All Ireland Cup in 2009 which went Dolphin's way 38-3. The sides did not meet again for 10 years, MU Barnhall, winning the home and away fixtures in 2019-20.

What Dolphin Player scored a hat trick against Barnhall - Wing forward Barry O'Mahony did on 17-10-2009 in the All Ireland Cup at Musgrave Park.

DOLPHIN LEGEND DECLAN KIDNEY

(The majority of members would know of Declan's association with Dolphin and being the most decorated Irish born coach, but our younger members would not realise how successful a coach he has been)

Declan's early rugby days may have been in the black and white of PBC, but he spent much time in Musgrave Park

watching various Dolphin sides with his dad Joe, who was Dolphin President in 1979. His brothers Kevin & Paul also played with Dolphin.

Declan played in 2 Munster Senior Schools cup flnals with PBC, being on the winning side in 1978 alongside Mick Kiernan. He went on to UCC and at just 19 he started his coaching journey with the PBC U 13 side. He continued playing and won a Munster Junior Cup medal with UCC. He moved up to coach the PBC Junior Cup side and they won four successive Munster Junior Cup titles. Four Senior cups in flve seasons then followed.

He coached the Irish Schools side for four seasons, highlights were a Triple Crown and in 1992 a 9 game tour to New Zealand. They won 7/8 warm up games against quality opposition. They came up short against a very good New Zealand side which contained future senior internationals, Jeff Wilson and Jonah Lomu, only a late Wilson penalty gave the home side victory.

He had being playing senior with Dolphin from the 80's until 1993, having played two seasons in the AIL making 11 appearances at 10 in the clubs 18 games. With Mick Kiernan being the designated kicker he did kick three conversions and also scored two tries and two drop goals. That makes him Dolphin's joint 4th drop goal scorer in the AIL. Interestingly, he played on the Dolphin 1986 & 1989 sides that beat Swansea and he scored a drop goal in both games.

In 1995 he took over as Dolphin coach from Phil O'Callaghan. With forwards like Terry Kingston, Tom Keogh, Eddie Walsh, Peter & Philip Scott, Philo built his game around a powerful rolling maul. Out went the hours of laps, scrum and maul practice, to be replaced by an extensive fitness programme and a quick ruck game. It took time to adapt, a realignment of the Divisions in the first season meant that Dolphin remained in Division 2.

He introduced many new systems, warm downs before they ever became fashionable. He attracted some young new talent for the 2nd season and the club won promotion to Division 1 in his 2nd year in charge (1996-97)

Dolphin did have a little wobble as the season was getting to an exciting stage, with four games to go, Kidney was off to Argentina coaching the Irish U 19 side at the World Cup. He did his preparation before he departed. He left two speeches to be relayed to the players, one for a win and one for a loss. Ireland were knocked out at the semi flual stage, he returned to oversee victory in the last two games.





Going to Malone for that final game, the side were extremely nervous, needing victory for promotion. Then Kidney produces a video, one he had got from a Hotel in Torquay of the antics of the team on a pre season tour, it took the tension out of everything and victory followed.

Deccie was on the rugby radar, Munster were looking for their first professional coach, John Bevan accepted the position but then changed his mind and rather than taking Dolphin to Division 1 Deccie went to Munster.

In 1997 and 1999 he brought Ireland to the semi finals of the U 19 World Cup, but 1998 was to be their year to lift the trophy. It was not without controversy, in the Q/F they were 17-0 down after 25 mins, they scored a last minute try which was converted by Brian O'Driscoll to level the game. It went to penalty kicks, flve players who were on the pitch at the final whistle, Ireland missed two and were out, but inexplicably South Africa used a player who had been replaced. This rule had been laid out at two pre tournament meetings and by the referee on the day, and Ireland went through to the final and brought the trophy home from France.

An historic three interprovincial titles in succession, a Celtic League Title, a European Cup final and semi-final appearance in successive seasons underline his coaching prowess and his ability to extract the best from his players. He also won a Triple Crown with Ireland A. He became Assistant to Irish Coach Eddie O'Sullivan in 2002. With O'Sullivan being offered a 4 year contract before the 2003 World Cup, this combination was not destined to last. Deccie went for the vacant Head Coach position with Newport Gwent Dragons in 2004, just as soon as he accepted it Gary Ella parted company with Leinster and less than 3 weeks after taking the Dragons job he was confirmed as the new Leinster Coach.

He re-joined Munster in 2005 and in his first season Munster won the Heineken Cup and again in 2008. The celebrations of the 2nd Heineken Cup were just dissipating when he took over the Irish Head Coach role in July 2008. Like his return to Munster, his first season was phenomenal a Triple Crown, Grand Slam and the Ireland Wolfhounds won their first Churchill Cup. He was awarded the IRB Coach of the year in 2009 and the Philips Manager of the Year for the third time in four years. He was awarded an Honorary Doctorate by UL in 2009. The World Cup in 2011 saw another quarter final exit, on the way they had their first ever clean sweep of their pool and first ever win at a World Cup against a major side (Australia).

In 2013 Ireland had a poor run, much of it due to a terrible run of injuries, culminating with a loss to Italy. That game is remembered for Peter O'Mahony being moved out to the wing due to injuries in the backs, and yellow cards for Brian O' Driscoll, Donnacha Ryan and Conor Murray. That loss was Kidney's flnal game in charge. He then changed direction and in August 2013 he was appointed Director of Sport and Physical Activity at UCC. He had other coaching opportunities but he wanted to be at home with his wife Anne who unfortunately passed away in 2016.

London Irish came calling and he was appointed a technical consultant in March 2018, moving roles to being Director of Rugby in May 2018. He is relishing the role with London Irish and hopefully he will continue to do so.

The weekend of 6/7th November was a very good weekend for our Girls sides.

Dolphin under 14 girls played played a thrilling and tough match against Kanturk under 14 girls on Sunday November 7th. The game ended with the Dolphin team winning the contest 37 - 34, with the lead changing sides throughout the match. The game was spirited and physical with our girls taking defensive honours, showing that the training ground tackling coaching is paying off. In attack the girls also successfully deployed some training ground attacking moves resulting in two well worked tries from the seven tries scored in total. Kanturk were strong league opposition and the team and coaches can be very proud of the result. The return match at Kanturk should be a cracker.

A good win for the girls U16s last weekend at Midleton against another Kerry team, Tralee this time but a less challenging affair than the recent tough game against Killarney. Putting in a positive response to that loss, Dolphin ran in a range of tries with some great passing moves from the backs in particular to end the game at 20-5. And good positional play all round to keep Tralee contained. You can really see the benefits of training coming through on the pitch and a strong forward line developing too. A game notable for its teamwork and sportsmanship, both on and off the pitch – sharing players with Tralee to help make up their numbers and a chat with them in the clubhouse afterwards.





Dolphin had great numbers at U12 for a Girls Minis Tournament in Ballincollig, attended by c 200 girls. One of the Dolphin debutants, pictured below was Aoibheann Pettman, her father (Mike) being very familiar to Dolphin members who were around between 2002-04.



30 Years ago 1990-91

Division 1 + 2 of the AIL started this season, but Dolphin had narrowly missed out on qualification so played in the Munster Senior League. They went on to take their 9th Munster Senior League Title and qualify for the Round Robin playoffs.

The draw saw Dolphin being drawn at home to Dungannon and Galwegians followed by a trip to Blackrock College. The opening game took place in Temple Hill as clubs could not play on their home ground. A 10-10 draw with Dungannon was followed by a 12-10 victory over Galwegians, thanks to a Michael Kiernan try, conversion, penalty and a drop goal.

With three teams going up and Galwegians losing their opening two games, the Blackrock College game was cancelled and Dolphin, Dungannon & Blackrock College were promoted.

20 Years ago 2000-01



The Division 2 season started well with a bonus point victory over City of Derry. Soon relegation was looming with six consecutive loses before they turned the season around with a draw and four wins from the flnal flve games. This included the highest score in the AIL that season, a 61-22 victory over Greystones.

John O'Mahony had a remarkable year with the boot. Including 2 tries he scored a very impressive 187 points in 14 games, remarkably Dolphin had 7/7 win/loss ratio. He kicked an average of 3 penalties a game in addition to an 77.5 % success rate with conversions, 24/31.

The Minor's won the Dennehy Cup, their fourth victory in the competition in flve seasons.



10 Years ago 2010-11

Having flnished in 3rd place in Division 1A the previous season, the clubs highest ever flnish, confidence was high that another good season was on the cards. It was an unusual season as there were just eight teams in Division 1A and this season there was no relegation as it was increased to ten for the following season.

The season started well with a victory over Shannon, followed by two points from three games and then victory over Cork Constitution. Dolphin flnished in 6th, ahead of Shannon & Garryowen.

The J2's won the J2 League this season.

Tomás O'Leary featured on the Irish side while Barry Keeshan and Christy Condon were again on the Irish Club side, Christy featuring on the Munster A side, winners of the British + Irish Cup.

Niall Scannell captained the Irish U 20 side while Ryan Murphy was capped on the Ireland U 19 side.

Future out half for the Girls sides?

A COUPLE OF STATS FOR YOU

- Ryan O'Herlihy became the 26th scrumhalf to start an AIL game for Dolphin in 443 games - just the 4th since Sept 2015.
- o None of the 20 players who played against Ballymena had ever kicked a penalty in the AIL- Cam O'Shaughnessy became the 22nd penalty scorer in 442 games.
- o Games between Dolphin & Buccaneers have generally been high scoring affairs. The least points scored in a game in the eight games so far was 24 points. In four games both sides played at least 20 points each.
- 17 Dolphin players have scored tries v Buccaneers, only two have scored more than one try. One of them is current Head Coach Brian Scott.

The Scramble for the 50th AIL appearance.

James Vaughan won the mini battle with Alex Denby & Barry Fitzgerald to make his 50th appearance against Ballymena.

In the following game against Old Crescent, Barry Fitzgerald made it no. 49 and Alex Denby No. 48.

Dave Byrne made it 60 appearances also against Old Crescent.



Darragh O'Mahony did not come through the traditional Schools route, attending Rochestown College which also was the Alma Mater of other internationals John Kelly & Richard & Paul Wallace.

Having played underage with Cork Constitution, he went on to UCC and played for Munster U20's and Irish Universities (6 caps) and Irish Students.

Having completed his degree he moved to Dublin to complete a 2 year diploma in UCD. His rugby career had started to take off, he was putting in good performances with UCD, Tyrone Howe withdraws from the Ireland A side, Darragh was called up and held his place for the next game.

The next thing he was playing a pre World Cup (95) warm up v Italy and made the World Cup squad for South Africa. It was an incredible 12 months for him, in 1994 he could not make the U 21 side, in 1995 he was playing against France in the World Cup.

On his return he joined Lansdowne and the following season he declared for Leinster and went on to make his first Heineken Cup appearances.

He was then offered a professional contract with Moseley, he left his Banking career behind him and headed to Birmingham where he was in rich try scoring form, scoring 32 tries in 33 games over two seasons in the English 2nd tier. He still has the record for tries in consecutive games for Moseley (5).

He was still on the fringes of the Irish Senior side as he was capped 3 times at each Moseley & Bedford Blues by Ireland A and did earn four full caps, scoring one try.



In 1998 he moved to the first division side Bedford Blues where he scored 11 tries, 2nd highest try scorer that season to the record breaking English try scorer, Rory Underwood. The club was sold on and O'Mahony moved to Saracens at the end of the season.

He spent flve seasons with Saracens, making 142 appearances and at one stage with 24 tries he was the clubs record try scorer. This included 3 in the Heineken Cup.

At 31, O'Mahony & Saracens called it a day and he decided to return to Cork and in October 2004 he made his Dolphin debut as a substitute against Highfield. He went on to start each of Dolphin's 31 games in that and the following season. In the 2nd season Dolphin won promotion to Division 1. He scored 10 AIL tries and is joint 15th in the table of Dolphin AIL try scorers.

In 2006 Darragh decided to return to Banking and took up a position with AIB in London. He returned to playing with Old Albanian's and he turned up on the bench for the Barbarians in 2008 against his old side Bedford Blues, his only appearance for the Barbarians.
