

Rainey Old Boys RFC



We welcome Rainey Old Boys to Musgrave Park for the first time. We travelled to Hatrick Park and were defeated 27-9 in November but the return fixture was never played. They will become the 14th Ulster side that we have hosted in the AIL and the 47th in all.

The club was founded in 1928 as Magherafelt RFC, it was not until 1947 did they become known as Rainey Old Boys RFC, from the Rainey Endowed School, better known as "The Rainey".

In 2004-05 they won the Ulster Qualifying League but lost to Naas & Nenagh Ormond, both by a point in the Round Robin, the following season they made no mistake and topped the Round Robin and qualifled for the AIL and defeated Youghal in the final of the All-Ireland Junior Cup.

In December 2019 they won the Ulster Senior League for the first time, they went on to defeat Blackrock College in the Division 2B Promotion Play off Final to be promoted to Division 2A.

Their Head Coach is Ian McKinley, the well-known former Leinster & Italian International. He retired having lost the sight in his left eye in a rugby accident and moved to Italy to coach but with the aid of specially made goggles he played in a 3rd Division game. He scored 28 points that day and he was back. He went on to play with Viadana, Zebra and Treviso and represented Italy 9 times. Following 6 years in Italy he returned to Ireland, to his wife Cordelia's home village of Bellaghy about 5 miles from the club grounds.

The doc/film Look Beyond which has been available on Net‡ix since 10/09/21 is on the life of lan McKinley, his story of growing up in Ireland, his dream of a rugby career, the accident that changed his life and his 2nd opportunity in Italy.

One thing both clubs have in common is they both started up Women's sides this season, Dolphin are slightly ahead as the Rainey Valentines was launched on 14th September.

Dolphin are hoping to put their 9th Oct record behind them, having played AIL rugby twice on that date, lost to Bangor 20-15 away & Blackrock 21-16 at home.

Like Dolphin they had an opening day victory, they did it the hard way, 0-17 down at home to Old Crescent after 15 minutes, ended up with a 24-17 victory.

The shortest Dolphin career of a British & Irish Lion



Mick Doyle played for Ireland in a 9-6 victory over Wales on Sat 12th March 1965, the following Wednesday's Cork Examiner, had the following report.

"Dolphin dropped a bombshell in Cork yesterday when they included international wing forward Mick Doyle of Cambridge University in their selected fifteen for next Sundays' Munster Senior Cup second round tie with Highfield.

*Castleisland born Doyle was injured during last Saturday's international v Wales but Dolphin hope that he will be fully recovered by the weekend and that he will turn out for them. It would be his first match in the Dolphin colours, although the Kerryman has previously played Leinster Cup rugby with UCD and Munster Senior Cup with Garryowen, In addition to this he once played at centre for Munster v Connacht in Galway."

The Dolphin team is as follows.

P. Berkley, D. O'Shaughnessy, J. Byrne, W. Brady, F. Harrington, G. Barry, N. Kavanagh, W. Barry, D.O'Neill, P. O'Callaghan, M.O'Leary, J. O'Sullivan, R. Lucey, J.Walsh, M. Doyle.

If Doyle is unable to play M. O'Leary will revert to the backrow with J. Rolfe playing second row.

* Just to clarify one point, he was from Currow, this small village and its environs produced three B & I Lions - Mick Doyle, Moss Keane & Mick Galwey. Also Irish Internationals, Tommy Doyle & Siobhan Fleming while J J Hanrahan played for Ireland U 20 and Emerging Ireland.

Dolphin 3 Highfleld 3

Highfleld led by 3-0 from a penalty goal until Derry O'Shaughnessy scored a try which at the time was worth just 3 points to level the game. Mick Doyle's 2nd (and flnal) game for Dolphin ended in defeat, Highfleld won 6-0 and went on to lift the Munster Senior Cup that season.

Career Highlights

His rugby career started at Newbridge College and from there he went to UCD to study veterinary science.

1965 was a busy year for Doyle. He made his Ireland debut against France on 23 January 1965, scoring a try in the game. Further representative honours were obtained on 07.12.1965, while studying at Cambridge University he gained a Blue in the 1965 Varsity match against the Oxford University. (5-5 draw)



He went on to earn the distinction of never being dropped during his 20 cap international career. Doyler, as he was affectionately known, made 11 appearances on the British & Irish Lions tour in 1968 including 1 test (South Africa) and scored two tries.

Two months after returning from the B & I Lions Tour, he made his final Irish appearance, in a victory over Australia.

Doyler played 20 times for Ireland, three of those appearances were with his brother Tommy appearing as the other wing forward.

He coached Leinster to Inter provincial Championship success flve times between 1979 and 1983 before coming Ireland coach during the 1984–85 season. Under Doyle's stewardship, Ireland, in 1985 won the Triple Crown and Five Nations Championship.

He was the British & Irish Lions coach for the 1986 South African Tour. He led Ireland to the inaugural 1987 Rugby World Cup, but suffered a heart attack at the opening dinner.

After retiring from coaching, Doyle became a TV panellist with RTÉ television, starting with the 1991 World Cup. He was tragically killed in a car crash in Dungannon in 2004.

Dolphin's 13th International

After his death, the clubs he played for were listed as Blackrock College, UCD, Cambridge University, Edinburgh Wanderers, Cork Constitution and Garryowen. Now as seen above, he also played for Dolphin. He was never listed as a Dolphin International, just an International who played for Dolphin during his career.

Reviewing it now, it appears that he should have been be classed as a Dolphin International. He played for Dolphin on 20th March 1965 with the replay the following week and two weeks later (10th April) he played against South Africa. So unless he transferred in the 2 weeks, he was a Dolphin player when playing South Africa and should be recognised as Dolphin's 13th International.



DOLPHIN'S MEN IN FRANCE

There are currently six former Dolphin players playing in Top 14 or Pro D2. Is this a record for an Irish Club? And a coach as well.

Sean Dougall was also playing in Pro D2 last year but his side, Valence Romans Drome were relegated at the end of last season.













They are already flve games into the season, how are they doing.

The Biarritz pair of Dave O'Callaghan & James Cronin have seen victories over Bordeaux and Racing 92. James Cronin started three of their games, but Dave O'Callaghan was forced off after 31 mins in their second game.

Dave Ryan's Agen run in D2 is not going any better than last seasons winless Top 14 season as they are 0/5. Dave has started three of those games.

Probably the most surprising results have been for Darren O'Shea's Vannes. They were unlucky not to be promoted last year, but have lost their opening flve games this season.

John Madigan has featured in each of Beziers opening flve games, starting in three. The club currently occupy 6th place, the flnal play off place.

Darren Sweetnam started the first two games for Oyonnax, they are presently 5th in the table.



Coach James Coughlan has seen some mixed performances at Toulon, Home form good, away form, could do better.



Congratulations Tomás and the best of luck in your new job.

We all know that Tomás was a CBC and Dolphin scrumhalf, but here is a question. Has he started more internationals than any other Dolphin scrum half with links to both CBC & Clongowes?

No doubt you have picked up from the way the question was asked, the answer is no. John O'Meara moved from CBC to Clongowes and the Dolphin No 9 earned 22 Irish caps, all starts. Tomás has 24 appearances from 19 starts and 5 as a replacement.

AIL Opening Round Statistics

- o This is the 14th season we have met UL Bohemian's, just the 2nd time it has been the opening flxture.
- o Prior to last week, had lost last six opening round flxtures.
- o The last win was also in Limerick, a 30-13 victory over Garryowen in 2013.
- o Three of the last four opening day wins have been away from home.
- o Last home opening league game win was in 2010, however, there was a run of five consecutive away opening games after that.
- o Dolphin's recent AIL form v UL Bohemians had not been good, seven consecutive losses.
- o Having been on the same number of AIL appearances as John O'Mahony since February 2020, Dave O'Mahony finally reached 124 last Saturday. He is now 2nd behind Barry Keeshan, if he plays every game he would catch up with Keesh on the opening game in 2026-27.

- o Brian O'Mahony became the 19th Dolphin player to score a try on his AIL debut.
- o Dolphin along with Blackrock College conceded the least number of points in the flve Divisions (50 clubs) last weekend. (But we scored one more point than BC, and we were away). It appears that Dolphin & Blackrock College are the only teams not to concede a try.

BLUE CRANE

Paarl Boys High School in South Africa ran an U15 Festival for the top 16 schools in the country between 18–21 st March 2016. From the 220 players that took part 21 were selected to represent South Africa under the name Blue Crane Invitational side, (the Blue Crane being the National Bird of South Africa.) 12/21 of the squad came from Greys College, in 2019 when this side were U18 and in their final

year, they went through the year unbeaten.

The tour took place five years ago this month, visiting Dublin, Limerick and Cork. The name Blue Crane will not mean much to many Dolphin members, apart from the team that took on the highly talented visiting side. In fairness to the Dolphin side they were still in the game until the last quarter. The talk around the club that night was how many of the Blue Crane side would make it to the top. So five years on, at the age of 20, how many have already entered the professional ranks.

Andre-Hugo Venter – has played URC with the Stormers, during the summer he was a replacement against the British & Irish Lions. Came up against another Dolphin man last Saturday night, as replacement hooker against Niall Scannell (for nine minutes)

Jan-Hendrik Wessels, like Venter, played for South African Schools. He moved to Clermont for a while after leaving school, returning to South Africa and has played Currie Cup for the Bulls.

Lesley Botha & Marcell Muller both went to Mountpellier from school but due to Covid they came back early and they were both signed by Cheetahs and have played Currie Cup.


