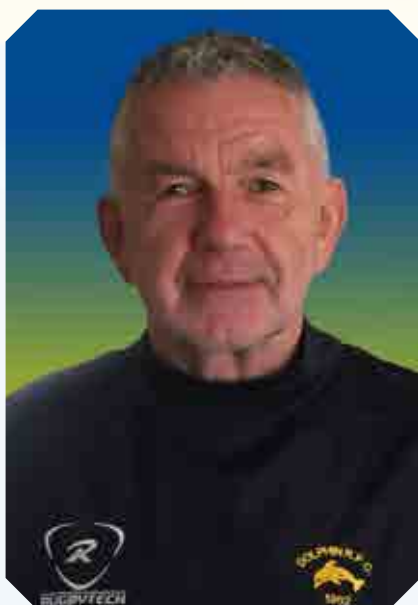

Cashel RFC was founded 1919.

In 2001/02 the Club finished bottom of Munster Junior League 3, they followed it up with back to back promotions. They were Munster Junior Club of the year 2009 - a year that saw the club win nine trophies.

They were Munster Junior Club of the year again in 2011, it was some season, they won the Munster Junior Cup, the Munster Junior League and the Munster Junior Clubs' Challenge Cup. The club's second team also enjoyed a successful campaign winning the Munster Junior Two League, the Webb Cup and the Gleeson League.

They went through 2011-12 AIL Division 2B winning all 15 of their games that year and becoming the first club in the history of the All Ireland League to achieve that feat.

Well known former players include Denis Leamy, John & Denis Fogarty, Paddy Butler & Brendan O'Connor. Leamy is the current contact skills coach with Leinster while John Fogarty is now National Academy Forwards Coach & Ireland Scrum Coach.

Cashel have defeated Dolphin in their four league fixtures, Conor Flanagan is the only player to score two tries in these fixtures.

Five of the Dolphin squad made their AIL debut v Cashel- Timmy Phelan, Ryan O'Herlihy, Dave Jennings, Mark Kavanagh and Craig O'Herlihy.

Mick Kiernan's International Debut



Mick Kiernan first came to prominence in 1976 as out half on the Munster Schools Junior Cup winning PBC side, following up with a Senior Cup medal winners medal. He represented Ireland Schools for two seasons before he joined Dolphin.

He was also a very talented athlete, in 1981 he managed to combine both, he toured South Africa with the Irish Squad, was on the Munster side that defeated Australia, was National 200m champion and represented Ireland v Scotland in athletics. In his first season with Dolphin he made three Munster appearances and the following season his Irish Senior debut.

The first match of the 1982 6 Nations championship was cancelled because of snow. Kiernan, just turned 20, was selected on the bench for Wales on 23.01.82, his chance came early due to a broken leg for the unfortunate David Irwin. Ireland won 20-12 and went on to win the Triple Crown, for the first time in 33 years.

In 1983 he toured New Zealand with the B & I Lions, starting in three tests.

In November 1984 Ireland played Australia, Moss Finn was the designated kicker and went down injured, Mick Kiernan took over. Not having taken a kick in his 13 previous Internationals, he stepped forward and was 3/3 on the day.

Fast forward to England 1985, having already defeated Scotland & Wales, the sides were level 10-10 in the dying minutes, Mick Kiernan was standing at first receiver, as Jim Sherwin called it on RTE Radio, 'Drop-goal on. Drop-goal taken. Drop-goal good! Kiernan was the hero. They won the Triple Crown and Championship as five Kiernan penalties gave Ireland a 15-15 draw with France.

He earned further Lions honours in 1986 against the Rest of The World in a game celebrating the centenary of the International Board.

In 1987 he appeared in the inaugural Rugby World Cup in New Zealand and Australia. He is pictured below scoring a try against Australia in the RWC Q/F in Sydney 07.06.1987.



When he retired, Kiernan was Ireland's fourth highest points scorer of all time, with 308 points (6 tries, 40 con, 6 dg, 62pen) in 46 International appearances. He scored a record 65 points for Ireland in their 1985 tour to Japan and in the inaugural World Cup (1987) was also Ireland's top scorer with 36 points.

He came out of retirement in 1994, persuaded by the Senior coach Phil O'Callaghan to come back for the last four games of the season as Dolphin needed to win at least three to remain in Division 2. Three victories later, Division 2 status retained, Kiernan finally got to hang up the boots after an victory away in Ballina on 09/04/1994.

Paul Mahony RIP

Paul made his Dolphin Senior debut in 1972, in a season that saw him win Cork Charity Cup and Munster Senior League medals while being on the losing side in the Munster Senior Cup final. The 1975/76 season saw him pick up 2nd Charity Cup + Munster Senior League medals, while again suffering disappointment in the Senior Cup Final.

Paul was Club captain for the Jubilee season, 1976/77 (pictured above) he made the Munster squad that season and led them to 3rd Charity Cup win in five years.

Paul joined Cork Institute of Technology in 1980 and was appointed a senior lecturer and head of the Department of Continuing Education in 1995 where he was very well liked and respected, writing several technical publications on accounting standards.

The Mahony family were synonymous with Dolphin, back in the 1920's & 30's, at least four of the seven Mahony brothers, Jack, Nacey, Theo and Kevin played with Dolphin, his uncle Jack was Dolphin's 2nd International in 1923. His father Nacey was very well known in rugby circles, he was Dolphin President in 1955-56, Munster Branch President in 1947/48 and IRFU President in 1973/74.

Paul's brother Brian was a Vice President of Dolphin and his sons Niall, Conor & Cian also played with Dolphin, Conor & Cian were integral members of the side which brought Dolphin to Division 1 for the first time in 1997.

Our deepest sympathies go to his wife Ruth, daughter Suzanne and son David.



DARYL FOLEY joins exclusive Dolphin Club

Last week, Daryl, became just the 11th Dolphin player to reach 100 AIL appearance last week in Nenagh.

Daryl's introduction to rugby was at Crosshaven RFC where he played until he went to CBC at eleven years of age. He went on to UCC where he was dual status in his first year, playing U20 & Senior with UCC and J1 with Crosshaven.

In 2010 he was on the UCC side that won the Frazer McMullen Trophy (All Ireland U21 winners), there was a big Dolphin connection in that side, half the pack, Gavin Duffy, Brian Quill, Brian O'Callaghan and Dave O'Callaghan went on to play for Dolphin. The Head Coach was Richie Kelleher who was full back on Dolphin's first ever AIL team. Forwards coach was Irish Club International Rory McGrath (93 AIL appearances)

On leaving UCC, he decided to give French rugby a try. He joined Rugby Chartres Métropole a club located c 80 km from Paris. He was joined by another former Dolphin player Don Horgan. Daryl started every game for RCM that season in Fédérale 1 (D4) and were a retaken lineout away from promotion.

He returned to Ireland and joined Dolphin in 2014, he was approached again by RCM at the end of that season to return to France, having completed his Masters in BIS he decided to remain and concentrate on his career with Dell.

He has now played 100/124 games following his debut v UCD in Belfield on 27.09.2014 as a substitute, another debutant as a substitute that day was Kevin Allen.

He has scored 9 tries, 60 conversions and 40 penalties, a total of 285 points.

He has the 3rd highest number of conversions in a season (for Dolphin) - he had 20 in the 2018-09 season. He was already exceeded this (by 2) this season in just eight games and has his sights on overtaking John O'Mahony (26) and Barry Keeshan (37)

Barry Keeshan scored 7 conversions in an All-Ireland Cup game, while Mick Kiernan, John O'Mahony & Daryl Foley (twice) have kicked six in AIL games.

He scored 50% more conversions in a single game (twice) than the club did in the entire 1994/95 season, in 10 games they scored 11 tries and converted four and stayed up.

Daryl was Senior Captain for the 2018-19 season, he will lead the side out once again today and we would ask everyone to give him the reception he deserves.

GERRY HARRINGTON

1960-2021

Gerry, as his friends would know was from Castletownbere, and proud of it. His parents moved to Finchley in London when he was 3 or 4 but Gerry was home every summer growing up and used to work on the family farm or on the boats. He was a very accomplished swimmer, on the radar of the British Swim Association, following an injury he decided to concentrate on rugby and spent eight years on the Saracens 1st side before returning to Cork when he was 30. The period of his life in England left him sounding anything but a West Cork man, I can remember many times when he would say to me "Ger, will you tell them I am from Castletownbere".

He had three passions in life, his family, rugby and The Arsenal.

It is sad that you only learn things about someone at their funeral. While we all knew of his love for Áine and the family, but we did not know how soon they realised they were the one for each other, in that they were engaged after five weeks and married after 18 months.

He played Senior for Dolphin for a period before taking up refereeing for a couple of seasons before he started coaching. His abilities as coach come to the fore with the success of his U 15 squad in 2012-13. They almost had the perfect season, winning 17/18 games, the sole blemish being the league semi-final to Skibbereen, but they got revenge in defeating them in the cup final.

Gerry was the instigator of the U15 + U16 Tours in 2013 +14 to Wales + England playing Penclawdd Tonyrefail and Newbridge. Many of the parents of this group showed their appreciation to his dedication and commitment by attending the Services.



He moved to coaching adult sides, starting with the J2's. He had a couple of successful seasons with them, bringing great structure, the players looking forward to pre-season as it would mean the legendary bonding sessions in West Cork. He joined Steve Ford's Senior set up as a specialist coach and responsibility for the J1's. Following a few seasons where fielding a J1 side was a problem, Gerry had them working together as the most successful J1 side for years. He was invited into the Sundays Well set up as a Specialist Coach for a couple of seasons before his illness took over.

Hopefully Áine and the family will have taken solace from the numbers who formed the guard of honour at Dennehy's Cross Church. The Dolphin members, the J2's and Cait's teammates in addition to the Sundays Well players he most recently coached, but there was no representative from The Arsenal.

Liam in his eulogy, finished by quoting Gerry speaking at his own father's funeral, when he finished by simply saying " thanks Dad", on behalf of all the players he coached and all his many friends in Dolphin, "Thanks Gerry"
