

Crescent College



Crescent College won the Munster Senior Schools cup in 1947, Father Guinane (better known as The Ginner) kept the side together and was instrumental in the set up of Old Crescent that September. In 1951 they reached the Munster Junior Cup final and attained Senior status in June 1952. The clubs first president was Ivan Harris father of the legendary Richard Harris who played with the club.

They purchased land at Rathbane and opened their club house in 1968. In 1975 they purchased more land at Rosbrien and their new clubhouse was opened in 1883 and the Rathbane grounds sold on to Limerick FC. In a further development in 2015 the club doubled the size of it's grounds to 25 acres and now have four full pitches, training areas and a car park with a 250 vehicle capacity. The grounds were renamed Takumi Park earlier this season.

John O'Mahony has fond memories of Rosbrien, it was there he became the 3rd player to reach 1,000 AIL points.

Old Crescent won the Division 2 title in 1995/96 winning all of their games, in 2002-03 Dolphin defeated Old Crescent at Lansdowne Road in the Division 2 final.

The sides have met 15 times in the AIL, three times in last two league campaigns, following a 13 year gap

The results have been very even, seven wins and a draw each- interestingly Dolphin won first game and lost the next four, then won the next four. Of the first eight games, there was only one game in Limerick, followed by five games on the trot in Limerick.

James Coughlan scored 37 AlL tries for Dolphin, but only managed one against Old Crescent. Jack Clarke, Tomás O'Leary Alan O'Sullivan and Cam O'Shaughnessy each scored two tries against Old Crescent.

A man who featured for both sides in recent years is Will Hanley.

Old Crescent were the winners of their home leg with a 33-12 victory over Dolphin in November.



MICK LANE

British & Irish Lion No. 329





A couple of weeks ago, many former British & Irish Lions, or their families received a lovely surprise in the post, receiving a B & I cap. Mick Lane who was recently 95, was on the 1950 Tour to New Zealand & Australia. The UCC winger made his international debut for Ireland against Wales in March 1947 in the then Five Nations Championship

He missed out on the 1948 Grand Slam through injury. He was back for all four of Ireland's matches in the 1949 Championship. They retained the Championship and the Triple Crown, narrowly missing out on back to back Grand Slams.

Another highlight for 1949 was his only appearance for the Barbarians during the Easter Tour against Cardiff, also scoring a try.

He impressed sufficiently in his four international appearances in 1950 to be selected for the B & I Lions Tour to New Zealand & Australia. He made a total of 11 appearances, scoring four tries on tour. A test winner against Australia and his appearance against New Zealand, resulted in a narrow loss.

He made three appearances in the 1951 Five Nations when Ireland once again won the International Championship. It would have been a second Grand Slam in four years had Wales not equalised to make it 3-3 in the final game at Cardiff Arms Park.

He played twice against South Africa in December that year, a test match for Ireland, and also with Munster. That was his only non Five Nations International.



In the second of his two appearances in the 1952 Five Nations, Lane scored his only points for Ireland with a try against Scotland. His final (17th) appearance for Ireland came during the 1953 Five Nations. The former Irish Sprint Champion transferred to Dolphin the following season.

It was interesting to note that in his 17 Ireland appearances, the opposite winger in seven games were Dolphin men, Bertie O'Hanlon & Maurice Mortell.

His nephew Mick Kiernan, himself an Irish 200m champion also played for the B & I Lions. Mick Lanes sister Angela was married to Jim Kiernan. Another team mate, Gerald Reidy was married to Jim Kiernan's sister Anne.

He played for Dolphin for just two seasons, at the end of the 1954-55 season both he and fellow B&I Lions player J S McCarthy retired.

He found himself opposite Jim Kiernan in December 1954 when playing for Dolphin v UCC in the Cork Charity Cup Final. Dolphin led 3-0 until seven minutes to go when Kiernan put over an equalising penalty from near the side-line, 35 yards out. The Cork Examiner reported an unusual event, when the equalising kick went over, one of the College players fainted with excitement, but was able to continue. Dolphin won the replay.

Dolphin also defeated UCC in the Munster Senior League final, while having played in earlier rounds, Mick Lane was unavailable to play in the final.

Lane was inducted into the Rugby Writers of Ireland Hall of Fame in 2011.

His sons, Joe & Martin played Senior for Dolphin, Martin is currently the clubs Grounds Chairman and a member of the Club Management Committee.



75th Anniversary of first cap 8th February 1947

BERTIE O'HANLON

Irish International No. 559 1947-50 12 caps 3 Tries





1948 GS Winners Bertie O'Hanlan & Jack Kyle

Born in Ballyclough, Mallow, his father was dispensary doctor, on his death, the family moved to Cork in 1932 he was introduced to rugby at PBC. At the age of twelve, he became a boarder at Rockwell College. An all-round sportsman, he also represented Rockwell at Gaelic Football and was South of Ireland sprint champion over 100 and 220 yards and long jump champion for two years.

Played scrum half on Junior cup side that also contained Dr Paddy Hillary President of Ireland

He moved to centre and played Senior Schools Cup for three years and in 1942 beat PBC in the final with Gerald Aherne at scrum half.

Rockwell College failed to retain the trophy in 1943, he agreed to play with Cork Constitution in the Munster Senior Cup. They sent a taxi to the school for him to bring him to Mardyke to play in MSC semi-final. They won and while he was a substitute for the final v the Army he still got his first MSC medal, he also won Minor Cup and League medals. He played in the Munster Junior Cup with Clonmel, but they were defeated in the final.

With all his friends in Dolphin he joined Dolphin in September 1943 but missed much of the season through injury. In 1945 Dolphin retained the MSC so Bertie claimed his second medal. Also, in 1945 he made his Munster debut, scoring two tries and playing against each of the other three provinces. Interestingly he played centre for Munster and later wing for Ireland.

He scored two tries on his international debut, a 22-0 victory over England on 8/2/1947. Barney Mullen tried a drop goal, it screwed off his foot and Bertie won race for touchdown. There was no luck involved in second try he collected a kick on his own 10-yard line, beat defender after defender to score by the posts. He was just the 2nd Irish player to score two tries on his debut.



He was selected thirteen times for Ireland but had to cry off against Australia in 1947 because of injury. He had a short international career of four seasons (1947-1950) that was littered with honours, two Triple Crown's and the Grand Slam. The pinnacle of his career should have been the Lions tour of New Zealand & Australia in 1950, in those days the tours lasted 6 months and he was asked by the IRFU to allow his name to go forward but his employers would not release him.

In 1948 has was Dolphin vice-captain and they were victorious in the MSC, and he won his 3rd MSC medal.


In 1951 he dislocated his shoulder in the Senior Cup v Cork Constitution, it never knitted, and his career was over at 28.

He died in 2016 at 91, the last surviving member of the 1948 Grand Slam Team.
